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### Mooney Appointed to National Cancer Institute's Board of Scientific Advisors



Oncology Nursing Society (ONS) member Kathi H. Mooney, RN, PhD, AOCN®, FAAN, a professor in the College of Nursing at the University of Utah in Salt Lake City, has been appointed to a five-year term on the National Cancer Institute's (NCI's) Board of Scientific Advisors (BSA). NCI Director Andrew C. von Eschenbach, MD, appointed Mooney to the position.

As a BSA member, Mooney will advise the NCI director and deputy director for extramural science and the director of each NCI division on a variety of matters concerning scientific program policy and progress and future direction of extramural research programs. This includes evaluation of NCI-awarded grants, cooperative agreements, and contracts as well as concept review of activities that the BSA considers to be meritorious and consistent with NCI's programs.

Mooney holds the Louis S. Peery, MD, and Janet B. Peery Presidential Endowed Chair in Nursing Research at the University of Utah. Her research focuses on the behavioral aspects of cancer, including cancer communication and cancer symptom management.

Within ONS, Mooney has served on the ONS Board of Directors, including a term as president from 1996–1997, the Nominating Committee, and various research committees.

"To be nominated for the Nurse of the Year award is an incredible honor," said Sampl. "Knowing I have made a lasting impression, even on just one patient, makes me realize that I have already achieved the most precious reward a nurse could ever have."

Kim K. Kuebler, MN, RN, APRN-BC, a regional medical scientist for Boehringer Ingelheim Pharmaceuticals who lives in Savannah, GA, and her coauthors, Mellar P. Davis, MD, and Crystal Dea Moore,

received second place for *Palliative Practices: An Interdisciplinary Approach* (Elsevier) in the Advanced Clinical Practice category. This is Kuebler's second *AJN* award. Her first award was in 2003 for *End-of-Life Care: Clinical Practice Guidelines* (Saunders), co-authored by Kuebler and ONS members Patricia H. Berry, PhD, APRN, BC, CHPN, and Debra E. Heidrich, MSN, RN, CHPN, AOCN®, which was awarded first place in the Advanced Clinical Practice category.

Other ONS members who received 2005 awards are Roberta Kaplow, RN, PhD, AOCNS, CCRN, who coedited *Synergy for Clinical Excellence: The AACN Synergy Model for Patient Care* (Jones and Bartlett), which was awarded Book of the Year in the Critical Care Nursing category, and Vivian Gedaly-Duff, DNSc, RN, who coauthored *Family Health Care Nursing: Theory, Practice and Research* (3rd ed., Davis), which was awarded third place in the Maternal-Child Nursing and Childbirth category. 

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
